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INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE SUBMISSION OF ABSTRACT

- 1. The abstract text must be no more than 350 words not including title and authors' information and should highlight the main points the presenter/s wish to communicate. If your abstract exceeds the length, it will not be accepted. Tables and Figures also aren't included in the abstract.
- 2. The sub-theme and the key area of your abstract must choose for submission. Check the list of sub-themes and key areas in above.
- 3. The abstract structure must include the following sections;
 - Title (max 20 words)
 - Contributors
 - First Name
 - Last Name
 - Primary Institution, City, Country (only one affiliation may be listed)
 - Background: Summarize the background of the study.
 - Purpose: Write the aim of the study within 1 or 2 sentences
 - Methods: Describe the methods that are applied to measure your research results
 - Results: A summary of major findings
 - Discussion: Interpretations, broader implications, future research
 - Conclusion: A statement of conclusion in your study
 - *Max 350 words, excluding title and contributor's details.
- 4. The abstract must be prepared in MS Word using the following <u>link:</u> FORMAT.
- 5. To submit, go to ichs2025.com (accessible only from 7 January onwards)
- 6. The abstract can be submitted in ONLY ONE of the following presentation preferences:
 - Oral Presentation: A 10-minute on-time presentation
 - E-Poster: A 7-minute pre-recorded video presentation using Power Point
 - * E-Posters will be displayed on the website of ICHS 2025 until May 30, 2025.
- 7. The ICHS 2025 Committee reserve the right to reclassify submitted abstracts into the most appropriate presentation type.
- 8. All submissions must be composed in grammatically correct English.
- 9. A maximum of six co-authors may submit a joint abstract.
- 10. All decisions on abstract acceptance are final. Once the decision has been rendered on an abstract, no further correspondence will be undertaken on the selection process.
